

### Introducing FMC's New App

Coming this month is First Methodist Conroe's new church member app, ShelbyNext! This app will make it easier for all church members to stay connected anytime and anywhere from their smartphone or tablet. Church members will have access to a variety of different and useful features right at their fingertips. With FMC's ShelbyNext app, church members will be able to manage and keep their account details current, access the church member directory, easily see current and upcoming calendar events, check in their child or youth into a Sunday school class or nursery, view their personal giving history, and offer their tithes and offerings.

Starting Sunday, August 13, parents within half a mile of the church will be able to use the app to connect to our church kiosk to check in and print labels for each child or nametags for each youth.

FMC values the importance of engaging all members through different approaches. Creating and establishing relationships with tools such as this app allows the opportunity to connect and grow together as a church. Check your email this week for your individual login link. ### **Grace for the Journey**

Sometimes we hear that someone says they have been saved as a way of explaining that their salvation took place on a certain day, a certain moment and is now over.

Salvation is not a static, one-time event in our lives. It is the ongoing experience of God's fractious presence transforming us into whom God intends us to be. John Wesley described this dimension of God's grace as sanctification, or holiness.

Through God's sanctifying grace, we grow and mature in our ability to live as Jesus lived. As we pray, study the Scriptures, fast, worship and share in fellowship with other Christians we deepen our knowledge and love for God. And, as we respond with compassion to human need and work for justice in our communities, we strengthen our capacity to love our neighbor. Our inner thoughts and motives, as well as our outer actions and behavior, are aligned with God's will and testify to our union with God.

As we grow in grace and live our lives in the gospel, prayer, study of the scriptures, fasting, worship, and connecting deeply with other Christians we shape and form more and more into the image of Christ. These spiritual practices or disciplines are called the Means of Grace.

We are to press on with God's help in the path of sanctification towards perfection.

By perfection, Wesley did not mean that we would not make mistakes or have weaknesses.



He did not imagine that we as humans would ever be without fault, rather he understood our sanctification to be a continual process of being made perfect in our love of God and each other and removing our desire to sin.

Our hope in Christ is to be made perfect in love.

Consider reading: Philippians 2:12-13, Philippians 3:10-13, Matthew 7:24, Colossians 3:10, and John 14:13.

Here are some ways that you can help this Sunday, August 6:

1. Support our ministry at Sam Houston Elementary School by giving to our Communion offering. The offering will support our efforts to lift up the faculty and staff at Sam Houston Elementary through small gifts and simple meals at busy times during the school year. It will also help our Girls on the Run program at Sam Houston that encourages physical fitness to girls in the third and fourth grade.

2. Sign up to volunteer at Sam Houston Elementary. Each year, members from our congregation read with individual children, small groups, or even classrooms. This kind of engagement with the children improves their literacy and success in school.

Volunteers also help with classroom preparation by doing

simple tasks for the teachers. Greeters are needed during special occasions such as Meet the Teacher Night and the first day of school. Motivators and coaches are needed for the Girls on the Run program.

3. Bring unused soap, socks, and underwear for elementary-aged children. Our United Methodist Women collect these items and distribute them to local elementary nurse offices through the CISD counseling department. Sizes can be from ages 4 through 12.

### Improving Lives Within the Community

FMC provides funding to help over 100 individuals/families in crisis annually.

The FMC Community Assistance team meets with individuals and families needing help on Wednesday mornings at the Crisis Assistance Center (CAC) in Conroe. The volunteers work with the families to understand the crisis and the need and provide clothing, food and/or rent/utility payments. The volunteers are familiar with CAC services and other agencies/services in Montgomery County and can direct them if additional help is



needed. Our volunteers also identify individuals who have both the motivation and ability to get out of the poverty cycle and refer them to the CAC Hand Up program that provides longer range goal setting, stewardship, training and support to achieve permanent self-sufficiency.

Some of those seen include:

- Seniors on fixed income with high medical or repair costs that they can't meet
- Individuals who are disabled due to illness or injury who have not yet qualified for disability payments
- Single moms who have been laid off or their children's father has stopped paying child support
- Victims of fire or flooding

Those helped are so grateful and often comment that the help they receive is a gift from God, an answered prayer. One family we recently helped with a mortgage payment wrote us a note which said the following: "It has been a tough year, but your kindness has been a light for us in a dark time. May God continue to bless your church family."

A disabled couple we helped over the last two years wrote to thank us for the help we gave them. They wrote that they were "...so grateful for [our] Christian love." The husband who is legally blind is going to training in Austin to run his own business and the wife just received an email offering her a local job. As they wrote in their note, they feel "God is opening doors" for them.
